Rules

- I. This contest is open to students from 4th through 12th grades. Entries will be separated into Junior (4th-8th grades) and Senior (9th-12th grades) age divisions. There must be 5 participants in each group to make a division or the judges will combine divisions.
- II. Contestants will be provided cuttings from trees for identification.
- III. Species of trees will be selected from the 4-H Forestry Judging Manual Senior Tree Identification List.
- IV. Contestants must be able to list the entire common name of the tree in question. Spelling counts.
- V. There is no charge for this event, however, an entry form is required for each entry.
- VI. All entry **forms** must be received by the **Habersham County Extension** Office by September 1st, 2011. You may mail them to **555 Monroe St., Box 13 Unit 50, Clarkesville, GA 30523**. Or you may drop them off at that address between 8:00-12:00 and 1:00-5:00 Monday-Friday.
- VII. Additional tree specimens will be utilized for breaking ties.
- VIII. Students will receive free admission the night of the contest. His or her name will be at the admission gate **ONLY** on the night of the contest.
- IX. The Fair Committee reserves the right to cancel this competition if there is a lack of participation
